



GARDEN GAZETTE, OCTOBER 2011

The October Planning and Scheduling meeting will be **October 25th**, **6:30 PM** at the **Collett Park Shelter House.** Education time will be Stephanie Krull of ISU. At the September 27th meeting there were 33 members present. A carry-in dinner was first, followed by a business meeting, and lastly the plant and seed exchange. The business meeting was called to order by President Larry Agee at 6:40 PM.

Vice President: Sam stated that he had educators lined up for October and November. Anyone having ideas for educators for next year please contact him.

Recording Secretary: (Bob) Two corrections from the September Garden Gazette. From Beth Keyes – the date of the second group that went to the State Fair booth was Thursday, August 18th instead of August 17th. Also Pat Secrest noted that the Gazette was titled Vigo County Gardener Gazette instead of Wabash Valley Master Gardener Association Garden Gazette.

Treasurer: (John) John gave the current balance. Received reimbursement checks for the Giving Garden and Chili Cook-Off registration.

Service Coordinator: (Cyd) Nancy Nation, Carol Dryer received their Certification and Teri Boland received her Advanced Certification.

Giving Garden: (Phil) Harvested over 9,300 lbs. so far, and new this year – several fall crops have been planted. Last year at this time the garden was all but done. There will be a workday scheduled in the next couple of weeks for fall cleaning of the garden space.

Head Bed Keeper: (Roger) The Patriotic Garden, Butterfly Garden, and 3rd and Maple Gardens look good. The 1st and Oak Garden has had a persistent problem with a type of grass (believed to be quack grass) all summer. The items in the garden may need to be removed so that the grass can be killed and then replanted. Maybe relocating them to the Giving Garden temporarily until this is accomplished. The First Financial bed has similar problems.

Soil & Water Conservation Education: (Pat) Pat stated he had 1,400 students pass through his caterpillar presentation in three days at the Fairgrounds. Jim Luzar and Pat appreciated all the help they received from the association members.

Family Learning Days: (Beth Keyes for Sharon Polge) – Learning Days were at the Vigo County Public Library, September 24, 2011, 9:00am to noon. Master Gardeners in attendance were Peggy Harlan, Kathy Hutton, Beth Keyes, Virginia Laycock, Debbie Lazzell, Carol Swearingen, and Pat Youman. They planted bean seed in small plastic cups with drainage holes, sprinkled grass seeds on top of the dirt, placed a napkin on top with a rubber band and put the cup in a zipper sandwich bag. This year we had 205 children plant beans.

Altrusa Chili Cook-Off: (Debbie Lazzell/John Hilderbrand) – This was our first time to compete in the Altrusa Chili Cook-Off. We had two 5 gallon pots of chili, one recipe was mild, and the other was <u>HOT</u>. John was the chief chef of the Hot and Debbie was the chief chef of the mild. John's Hot Chili received first in the Commercial Group category. We spent a total of \$123.00 out of the \$150.00 budget. The "Green Thumbs" of the giving Garden had an enjoyable day, and made many community contacts.

Christmas In The Park: (Pat Secrest/Beth Keyes) – Pat stated that the committee was working with a new theme this year, "Candy Land Holiday". Workdays will be announced and setup will be the Friday after Thanksgiving. Lights will be turned on December 5th and turned off on December 26th. We will have the train ride concession Saturday the 17th from 6:00pm to 8:00pm. All the receipts of the ride and hot chocolate go to the association.

2012 Spring Seminar: (Teri Boland, Paula Wilson, Carol Swearingen) – March 10, 2012, at St. Mary of the Woods College. Vice President: Sam Liggett called the meeting to order at 6:05pm.

Vice President: Sam stated that Stephanie Krull will be the educator for the October planning and scheduling meeting.

Recording Secretary: Bob Archer read parts of last month's board minutes.

Corresponding Secretary: Verna Gaskin – nothing to report.

Treasurer Report: John Hilderbrand gave the balance as of the board meeting.
