Meeting called to order at 6:30pm by Vice President Charlene McKean.

RECORDING SECRETARY: Carole passed around an attendance sheet.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: Verna passed out copies of a 2018 calendar of events to members. She asked members to watch out for emails from her as she

WABASH VALLEY MASTER GARDENERS BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING JANUARY4, 2018, 6:00pm VIGO CO. LIBRARY, ROOM 6

PRESIDENT, Phil Small called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. He welcomed two new officers, Vice-President Ruth Bohner and Treasurer Brenda Christianson and welcomed Bob Archer back as a Director. Phil said since he is new to the office of President that he felt a need to explain what he thinks his role is. First he thinks that it is not his job to make all of the decisions and that Board members should expect to share in decision making. Agendas will most likely be the same as in the past. Officers should plan to b ring up new business items when they make their reports to the board.

MEMBERS IN ATTENDANCE: Phil Small, Ruth Bohner, Carole Dreher, Verna Gaskin, Brenda Christianson, Larry Agee, Sam Ligget, and Bob Archer.

NON BOARD MEMBER IN ATTENDANCE: Dana Gadeken, Purdue Educator.

MINUTES OF LAST BOARD MEETING: Carole Dreher said that minutes for the November Planning and Scheduling meeting had been published in the December 2017 Gazette. There was no Board of Directors meeting in December.

VICE PRESIDENT: Ruth Bohner said she has a speaker for the January meeting – Emily Bruno. Emily will need a computer to go with her presentation. Ruth asked about how we handle any compensation for our speakers. Phil said that we usually give them gift cards/certificates and he gave her one for Red Lobster. He said that she can get one or more at any location she deems appropriate and submit a receipt and request or reimbursement to the Treasurer.

Ruth also presented an idea to help teachers teach their students learn how plants grow. She brought two possible projects with her. One project was a kit for an amaryllis plant and the other was a glass vase which could hold a bulb (hers had a hyacinth bulb). The nice thing about the vase is that the students would be able to see the roots develop, but the only thing they would have to do with the kit is start watering it. She discussed potential cost and noted that we have to get permission from the VCSB to offer the project and noted that some teachers might already have projects of their own. Ruth will do further work on her project.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: Verna said that he had been contacted by a couple of members who said that they have had problems getting enough volunteer hours and asked if they could be made honorary members. A discussion ensued

about honorary members and inactive members. Members of the Board asked who should be on these lists and why.

Verna said that the date for Earth Day at the Woods has been set for 4/28/18.

TREASURER: Brenda Christenson distributed some final 2017 reports which were prepared by outgoing Treasurer Mary Beth Prickel.

SERVICE COORDINATOR – Jessica Fields was absent. There was discussion about the reporting of volunteer hours – who checks the on-line hours reported and who enters hours for members who submit written reports instead of entering them on-line. Dana Gadeken said that she had hoped that Jessica would help with these tasks and had secured additional clearance for her on the website.

COMMITTEES:

GIVING GARDEN – Bob Archer and Phil Small reported that IVY Tech is planning to do more outside planting this year, but we may still have use of the greenhouse to start plants for our purposes. We will, however, have to get our own potting materials. Phil said that he, Bob Archer and perhaps Gene Jarvis hope to meet with John Rosene at IVY Tech to discuss use of the greenhouse.

WEBSITE – Sam Ligget reported that he had made a slide show of our prize winning Christmas in the Park display for the website. He plans to put up information about the Spring Seminar soon.

PUBLICITY: Phil said that it was determined that Verna is responsible for this committee and wondered if she needed to add members. Carole Dreher noted that at one time we had two members volunteer to handle publicity. One was Jessica Fields and the other was an intern who is no longer active. It was generally agreed that publicity is important for several of our activities, especially our upcoming Spring Seminar.

AUDIT COMMITTEE: Sam Ligget said he will have to wait to finalize the committee until after the January 16th meeting when the committee sign-up sheets will be offered to members. He expects the committee to include Carl Trent, Mary Beth Prickel, Brenda Christianson, himself and two other members. He hopes to conduct the Audit in late January or early February.

SPRING SEMINAR 2018 – Phil Small said that two speakers have signed up. John Rosene would like to do a presentation on weeds. They will still need 2-3 more speakers. A committee meeting is planned for Wednesday, January 10, 2018 at 10:00am at the United Methodist Temple in Terre Haute.

OLD BUSINESS:

CHRISTMAS IN THE PARK WRAP UP – Ruth Bohner and bob Archer reported that the committee had expenses of \$200. They were thankful for the members who volunteered to help on this project. Bob said that all items were removed from the exhibit except for some stakes which were frozen in the ground.

NEW BUSINESS:

PROPOSED SPENDING BUDGET – 2018 – Brenda presented a proposed budget for 2018 expense items. There were discussions about various line items.

There was discussion about the physical address versus the P.O. Box address and when should each be used. Phil asked about business cards and said that he has sometimes been asked for one by people he has spoken with. Carole Dreher and Dana Gadeken volunteered to design one.

GRANT OPPORTUNITIES – Dana Gadeken said that Rethink needs to have some Master Gardeners help plan and check on three gardens. Basically just have access and help oversee them. Dana requested permission to take the project to the membership. She was given permission to do so, but was told that a representative of the group had previously asked for our group to help but denied because at that time it sold their produce and we were not allowed to help. SPRING 2018 INTERN CLASS – Dana Gadeken reported that 7 people have submitted paperwork. She will be going on WTHI to talk about the class.

COMMITTEE SIGN UPS – at this point there was discussion about whether Brenda needs a Finance committee. Some said the sign-up sheets will be offered at the January Planning and scheduling meeting.
