Giving Garden Corner **A monthly update**

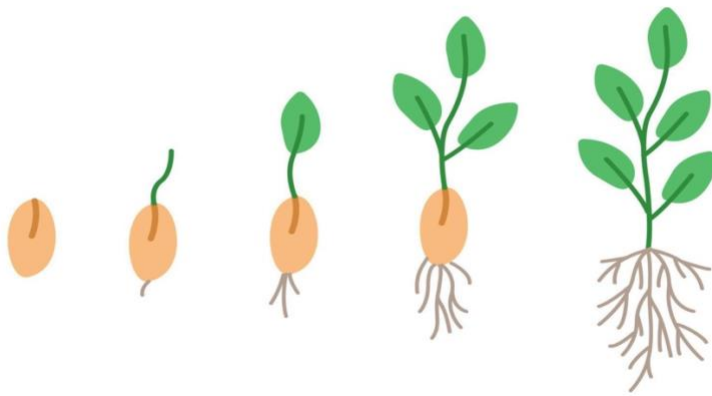

**WVMGA Planning and Scheduling Meeting
January 28, 2025
6:30 to 7:30 p.m.**

Meeting was bought to order at 6:30 p.m. by Beth Lutz. No December meeting minutes reported.

Treasurer's Report – Susie Thompson

Susie reported on bank balances and that three checks were disbursed as follows:

1. Christmas Party expenses,
2. Herb Faire to reserve tables,

3. Insurance policy for a fidelity bond – this policy covers if money goes missing for whatever reason.

2025 Budget - Beth Lutz:

A copy of the 2025 Budget was sent to all members via email. Beth noted these are estimates of what could be spent. Copies were passed around for members to view.

Susie Thompson went over the budget explaining what was spent in 2024 and the proposed 2025 budget. Susie moved to adopt the new budget; Gene Jarvis seconded the motion. The 2025 budget was approved with no opposition.

Continuation of Christmas in the Park – Beth:

Membership was asked if we are going to continue to participate in Christmas in the Park. Beth reported the last two years no one has signed up to lead or participate in the event, even though we still participated in 2024. Beth stated if we are unable to get someone to spearhead the project then we will vote next month to consider staying in or withdrawing from the event which would mean losing an opportunity for \$500 minimum earnings. There was open discussion on the pros and cons, but it was noted we would most likely not get the shelter back if we let it go. There was some discussion on the merits of the program, and that we have an aging group to continue committing to this size of project without a lead.

Education – Angie Decker: We are working on the education schedule and will reschedule Tabby's presentation which had been scheduled for this meeting. Look for that in March. Ruth Bohner and Patti Weaver are working together to bring us a presentation on CoCoRaHS (Community Collaborative Rain, Hail, and Snow Network) at the February meeting.

Wednesday, June 18 from 5:30 to 8:30 is the date and time for our fund-raising event, Twilight in the Garden. Angie has confirmed with Tabby that volunteers will have the opportunity to earn both volunteer and education hours, but we do not yet know exactly how that will be divided.

No report from Lynda.

Service Coordinator Report – Patti Weaver: Patty has completed reporting hours for the members for the year of 2024.

Discussion circled back to Christmas in the Park noting that the last day of the train ride had a great turnout. Money has not been counted yet. Mike McIntyre, the Grinch, showed up as usual. Mike does have the sign done. Hoping to have for use at the Herb Faire or maybe Earth Day. We will share the sign with everyone at the next meeting.

Giving Garden Update - Phil Small: The Giving Garden has been extremely busy with activities. The last two years focused on education plus donating. This year, the plan is to concentrate a more on education with an increase in opportunities such as creating gardening for folks with limited resources. The seed starting opportunities will be in the Ivy Tech greenhouse again this spring, starting in late February or early March. Mark your

calendar for a planning meeting on March 1 at 1 p.m. at United Methodist Temple. Please come join if you want to help. Cleaning up the blackberry beds in the Giving Garden will start later in February and early March for cleaning out dead vines and weeds, etc. They are not thorny blackberries.

Angie Decker reported the Giving Garden has been selected for 3 separate Seed Trials -

1. First time seed trial through the USDA Seed Bank - 3 international tomato varieties. Peru, Ecuador, and China.
2. Seed Savers Exchange - 3 varieties of Heirloom Beefsteak tomatoes.
3. Seed Savers Exchange - 3 varieties of Heirloom Sweet Corn

The organizations send free seeds, we will make and record observations.

Beth reported that the Sisters of Providence Earth Day event is April 26 at Saint Mary-of-the-Woods. The theme this year is broader than normal, Our Power, Our Planet. She noted the weather can be cold that time of year.

Herb Faire - Debbie Lazzell: Phil Small will be growing tomatoes for the Herb Faire scheduled for May 10.

She wants to sell flowers blooming in flats – possible vendors Anderson’s and District 6 on consignment. Debbie is going to try to grow gourds and is looking for donation of any type of antique container to create assorted pots to sell.

Twilight in the Garden – Angie: The committee met before this meeting tonight with discussion about potential sponsors. If you know of anyone, please let Angie know. Several sponsorships are available at different levels. A flyer will be available. More information at the February meeting. The committee has not narrowed down any particular kind of sponsor.

Grants – Angie: WVMGA was invited to apply for a Wabash Valley Community Foundation Grant. A full application has been submitted. The grant will be awarded sometime mid-April.

The Benson, Baur and Young Trusts distribution at First Financial Bank Conference Center will be awarded February 5. No amount known yet.

New Business – Beth: Committee sign-up sheets are out, so please sign up if you haven’t already. Any questions, ask around. The sign-up sheets will go to committee heads soon. We are still in need of a head bed keeper which is a liaison with the parks department.

WVMGA Board Meeting

April 3, 2024

6-7:30 pm

Called to order at 6 p.m. by Beth Lutz

The group discussed the lack of minutes available for this year's meetings. Our organization is required to maintain minutes by the state of Indiana as well as by granting agencies. There was also discussion about the roles of the board.

Susie is working on the membership list and had some questions about active members who are not submitting hours. The Master Gardeners are required to submit 12 hours of volunteer time and 6 hours of education annually. Interns are required to submit their volunteer hours until they are certified then continue recording both volunteer and education after becoming certified. Tabby will contact both members and interns to remind them to enter hours into the Master Gardener website. Another issue regarding the membership list is to clarify the categories of forever, honorary, and alumni Master Gardeners. (*See explanations following these minutes.*)

We also discussed whether a member residing in another state could be part of the WVMGA. Specifically, an Illinois MG has asked one of the board if they can transfer to WVMGA. This issue will be forwarded to Tabby.

Susie presented the financial report and noted that she made \$1 and \$2 donations to test the Square reader. The fees have for the credit card acceptance have increased from 2.6% of the amount charged plus \$0.10 per transaction to 2.6% plus \$0.15 per transaction. The amount of fees will be tracked on the financial reports.

It was requested that Susie report the amounts of funds restricted for specific purposes at the S&P meeting. The Bob Archer donations and the grant amounts restricted for the purchase of a tractor and related accessories for the giving garden are the restricted funds.

Beth reported that she had received notice from the Wabash Valley Community Foundation that we had received our requested grant funding. The check will be presented on Wednesday, April 9, 2025. Angie Decker and Phil Thompson will be there to receive this award.

Beth reported that next week there would be a meeting regarding a demonstration of the QGiv application to allow online donations as Square doesn't have this capability. Beth, Susie, and Angie will be attending.

Beth also reported that she had received a request from Sullivan County Soil and Water Conservation to attend and have a table at their Earth Day celebration on April 22, 2025. Beth will announce at next S&P meeting to request volunteers. She also received a request from Harrison Crossing for assistance in landscape/garden projects that they are planning. Consensus was that we don't have volunteers available for this project.

Beth also reported that she had seen the new WVMGA sign, and it had been moved to the trailer by the Giving Garden. She said that it would need a mechanism to hold it up or a frame from which it could be hung. Additional information will need to be gathered and evaluated to determine the next steps. The sign is aluminum and is 4 feet by 6 feet.

Meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

Alumni Status (summarized from the Purdue Extension Master Gardener Program Policy Guide)

To qualify for Alumni Status, a member must have completed at least ten years of active volunteer service and have achieved at least the Advanced MG silver level (500 cumulative volunteer and 75 cumulative education hours.) An application must be submitted to Tabby as our extension coordinator for approval. The application is in the policy guide. If you don't have a copy of the policy guide, you can download a copy at edustore.purdue.edu

Honorary Membership (Bylaws, article 3, section 2E)

Honorary membership may be extended to any individual, not a member of the WVMGA, in recognition of contributions to this organization, and/or their dedication and support of the ideals of the WVMGA. Honorary membership does not confer any privileges, responsibilities, or obligations.

Forever Master Gardeners (Draft of a proposed amendment to the bylaws)

A “Forever” Master Gardener is one who is or has been a Wabash Valley Master Gardener for at least five years and has attained, at minimum, the Bronze Award level in accordance with the Purdue Master Gardener guidelines. These requirements may be waived if the member has made significant contributions to the organization in service and is voted on by the membership. The member’s name is placed on the Forever Master Gardener roster along with the year of master gardener certification. Upon the death of the member, a plaque with their name and years from certification until death is placed on the memorial garden fence at 1st and Oak Streets at the entrance to Fairbanks Park in Terre Haute.

Top Vegetables to Plant in August

1. Radishes

Time to Harvest: 25–30 days

How to Grow: Sow seeds 1/2 inch deep in loose, well-draining soil. Thin seedlings early to prevent crowding. Water consistently to keep roots tender.

Tip: Grow in partial shade during hotter days to prevent bolting.

2. Lettuce

Varieties: Loose-leaf, Romaine, Butterhead

How to Grow: Direct sow seeds or transplant starts. Keep soil moist but not soggy. Use a light mulch to keep roots cool.

Tip: Grow under shade cloth in hot zones; harvest outer leaves continuously for prolonged production.

3. Kale

Days to Maturity: 50–70

How to Grow: Direct sow or transplant in rich, well-drained soil. Water regularly and mulch to conserve moisture.

Tip: Cold weather improves flavor; consider planting curly or Siberian varieties for cold tolerance.

4. Spinach

Time to Harvest: 40–50 days

How to Grow: Sow in partial shade to prevent heat stress. Fertilize lightly with a nitrogen-rich mix to promote leafy growth.

Tip: Choose bolt-resistant varieties for warmer climates.

5. Turnips

Dual Purpose: Grow for roots and greens

How to Grow: Direct sow seeds 1/2 inch deep. Thin seedlings to 3 inches apart for root development.

Tip: Water evenly to avoid cracked roots. Harvest greens early and roots at 2-3 inches in diameter.

6. Carrots

How to Grow: Choose a sandy, loose soil free of stones. Sow thinly and keep soil consistently moist for uniform germination.

Tip: Cover rows with boards until sprouted to maintain moisture.

7. Beets

How to Grow: Sow seeds 1 inch apart and thin early to avoid overcrowding. Grow in full sun with consistent watering.

Tip: Use thinned seedlings as baby greens. Harvest roots when they reach 2 inches across for best flavor.

8. Broccoli

How to Grow: Start from transplants for fall planting. Space 18 inches apart in nutrient-rich, moist soil.

Tip: Add compost before planting and mulch heavily to conserve moisture. Harvest the main head before it flowers.

9. Cabbage

How to Grow: Transplant or direct sow into fertile soil rich in organic matter. Space 12–18 inches apart.

Tip: Feed regularly and water deeply. Netting or row covers help protect from cabbage loopers.

Herbs That Thrive When Planted in August

1. Cilantro

How to Grow: Sow seeds directly into the garden in partial sun. Space about 1-2 inches apart.

Tip: Water regularly and harvest leaves young for best flavor. Bolts easily in heat but thrives in cool weather.

2. Parsley

How to Grow: Soak seeds overnight before planting. Choose a partially shaded spot and keep the soil moist.

Tip: Harvest outer leaves regularly to promote new growth. Protect with mulch if overwintering.

3. Dill

How to Grow: Direct sow into full sun in fertile, well-drained soil. Dill prefers cooler weather and may bolt in heat.

Tip: Harvest leaves before flower heads form. Collect seeds later in the season for drying.
